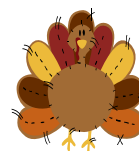
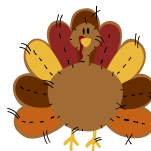

THOUGHTS FOR THE ROAD

November 2012

Well the riding season here in our area may well be done for most of us. There may be a couple of nice days here and there throughout November, but is it worth getting that clean bike out for it? That's the problem if you basically have your bike settled in for the long sleep til spring.

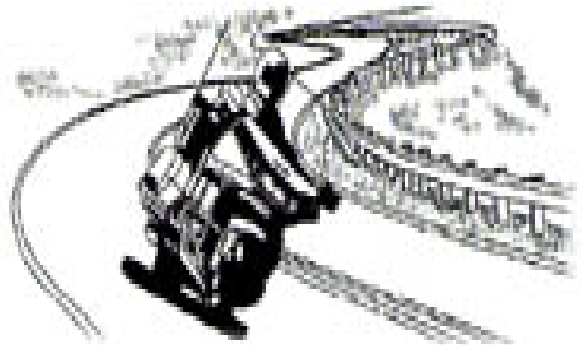
It's always best to put a clean bike up for the winter as it saves the paint from scratches. You will want to get a stabilizer (Sta-Bil—Star-tron) into the gas tank and through your engine's fuel system so everything is protected from moisture that is present in your gas via the ethanol. Make sure you run your engine about 5 minutes. If you can you should change the oil and filter, so the engine is free of contaminants as it sits there til spring. Make sure all of the different electric accessories (Radio--CB--Nav sys--intercom --extra sound sys.) are turned off before you attach your battery tender.

I usually 0 out the hydraulic suspension, (carry over from the 1500 air shocks) put the bike on the center stand and place a block of 2x4 under the engine to elevate the front wheel off of the floor. This way the bike sets with both wheels off of the concrete and takes the pressure off of the front forks. Check the tire pressures and set them at the correct settings, this will have them close in the spring when you want to ride that first time and don't take the time to check the pressures. I have read articles that discourage the use of sheets or old blankets to cover the bike during the winter due to condensation forming on the bike and not being able to dry. (breath)

If you do ride in the winter months don't bundle up so much that you can't turn your head to check on traffic when turning or passing a vehicle. Don't forget that most motorists won't be looking for bikes at this time of the year.

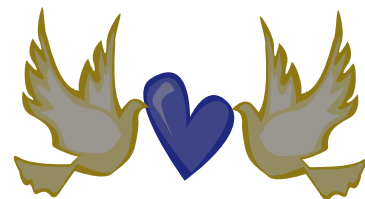

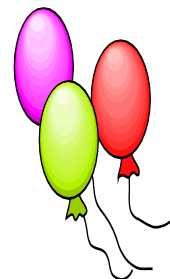
